Lexi Kuffel, Lauren Pearson, and Mad-die Severt all qualified for State in the sprint relays -- 400 and 800 meters -- while Lauren also com-peted in the long jump in 2022.

Mr. David Martin, high school English teacher, is in his 20th year as head coach and helps with every event. Returning coaches are Tanner Drew -- who is the jumping coach -- and Andrea Pearson, who helps with jumps, hurdles, and relays. New this year is Mr. Jay Cornell to coach the throwers, sprinters, and distance runners.

The athletes have already enjoyed some success this season, highlighted by the strong, bal-anced

Heart of the North meet, and plac-ing second at three other meets. The boys team has been improv-ing over the course of the season, with their best finish of fourth place at both Chetek and Barron.

Additionally, on April 25 at the Chetek meet, Lexi Kuffel was awarded the Knicker Invite "Meet MVP" award for helping her 800 meter relay place first, and placing first and second in the 200 and 400

meter dashes. Her relay, consist-ing of Lexi, Lauren, Maddie, and freshman Jordyn Lundequam, even had the fastest time in Divi-sion 3 in the state at one point.

The Comets wrapped up the regular season and now they look ahead to Conference, Regionals, and Sectionals. This year's Sec-tional track meet will be held at Cameron High School on Thurs-day, May 25. The Comets will look to qualify as many events as possible to the State Meet in La Crosse. Good luck, tracksters!






